## *President's Message*

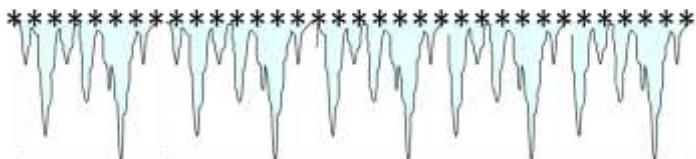

**Book Sale**

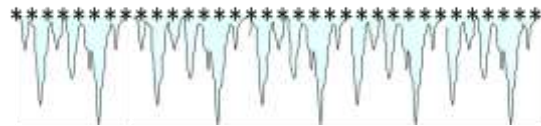
Toni announced that Price and Sorts will be weekly on Thursday mornings until the sale in April. She ordered \$200.00 worth of colored dots.
